What should I do?

- Report to the Title IX Coordinator – Benito Gonzales, Director of Human Resources ext. 2115
- Report to the Vice President for Student Affairs – Jeff Long ext. 2221
- Report to your VP, Dean, Director, Chair
- There is an online reporting form on the new website

Confidentiality

- Before a complainant discloses information they want to keep confidential, they need to understand your obligation to report sexual misconduct to the Title IX Coordinator or other designated administrator.
- If a complainant discloses information but requests confidentiality or asks that no action be taken, let them know their request will be honored to the extent possible, limiting our ability to respond to the incident. However, if an investigation and response is necessary to ensure a safe campus environment for all students, maintaining the victim's confidentiality may not be possible.
- In those situations where a response is required, information is shared on a need-to-know basis.

Conduct Proceedings

- Consistent with Title IX standards, decisions in conduct proceedings are based on the "preponderance of evidence" standard which requires evidence showing that it is more likely than not that the accused is responsible.
