## 4. Administrator's Report:

Dr. James Johnston

Drs Johnston and Laurenz are visiting with the programs across campus and he is appreciative of these meetings and the time faculty are taking to share about their programs. This is a listening/learning tour of sorts for him and this information is being taken in to help him craft the strategic vision of the university moving forward for growth and enrollment. The budget is laid out for the most part, but it is not without opportunity for strategic use. The budget goes before the Board of Regents tomorrow for approval.

Everyone will be receiving a 6% raise in their fall contracts, there are additional monies to retain and attract faculty as well. Dr. Laurenz will speak more on this in a moment. Previously ENMU employees paid 35% of their insurance premiums and ENMU paid the remaining 65% - this will be adjusted to an 80/20 split; a 15% decrease in cost for employees.

There will be a formal press release on budget details, but for an overview: HB 2 brings a \$4.5 million increase. The RPSP was increased by \$54,000, SB 192 Junior Bill earmarked \$285,000 for ENMU Main campus. HB 505 will provide \$7.5 million, some of which will assist in Roosevelt Hall but also other campus improvements. The BRNR increased by \$680,000. There is a request with HED to assist in the demolition of Bernalillo and Harding Halls as well. There are requests in to support the city of Portales for sidewalk and road improvements and maintenance. There is a lot of movement projected in this shorter session.

Dr. Johnston expressly thanked Dr. Laurenz for his work on salaries and ensuring faculty are compensated. There is also a great emphasis on working with the new CIO with prioritization on tech and the student experience.

#### Dr. Jamie Laurenz

The state has provided \$340,000 toward faculty salaries. The first course of action was to address adjunct pay. Undergraduate will move from \$700 per SCH to \$800 and graduate courses from \$900 to \$1000 per SCH. This takes about \$125,000. From here there will be an increase in the minimum salary for each rank: instructors will increase from \$48k to \$52k; assistant professors will increase from \$58k to \$62k; associate professors will increase from \$68k to \$72k; and full professors will increase from \$78k to \$84k. This will result in salary compression for those in these positions and these have also been evaluated. In the fall contracts all will receive 6%, but some may receive more – all the way up to 9%, based on need to address equity. For those up for promotion, you will receive the 8% as well as the 6% as an acknowledgement of this accomplishment as well as the allotted raise.

As to IT. Please forward specific concerns to him, include your chair and dean so they are aware as well. The new CIO begins June 19<sup>th</sup>, but he does not want to wait this long to address concerns. The goal is to take an inventory this summer to better equip the campus for next AY. We are assessing Mediasite and while they have a new generation being released ENMU wants to make sure we make the right decision for lecture capture and hybrid platforms. Mediasite will remain in place and other options will be reviewed starting this fall. Faculty will be invited to give feedback as well as test out other options, similar to the way LMS platforms were explored. He has heard of our technology town hall idea and he is fully supportive of it. It would be a great avenue to discuss not only concerns but suggestions for improvements as well.

It is registration time again and thank you for all you do. Please reach out to advisees who have not yet registered for the fall term, as this is a small gesture that goes a far way in terms of commitment to return after the summer break.
