This degree plan is a guide only. Consult with an adviser before enrolling in courses. For more detailed information on coursework and degree requirements, refer to the catalog and consult with an adviser.

The Bachelor of University Studies degree is a flexible degree program available to full- or part-time students. The program is especially designed for those students who have gained significant learning through their work/life experiences. At the time of entrance into the program, each student must complete a degree plan with the university studies adviser in the College of Education and Technology. The dean shall have final approval authority for each proposed university studies degree plan. This degree plan will indicate the structure of the student's proposed plan of study and ensure that all degree and University requirements are met.

All course requirements in the major must have a grade of "C" or better. All acceptable transfer work from a junior or community college will be recorded as lower division credit.

Note: All Bachelor degrees at ENMU require 120 minimum total credit hours including 40 upper-division (300-/400-level) hours. B.A. candidates must satisfy the language requirement (6-14 hours). Developmental and vocational/technical courses will not be counted toward graduation requirements.

Note: The B.U.S. degree cannot be completed concurrently with any other bachelor's degree. The B.U.S. degree is not available as a second bachelor's degree.

REQUIREMENTS for B.U.S. Degree (30 hours)

Emphasis of two 15-hour blocks in two fields of study (30 hours). Each course must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher.
