This major requires a minor or a second major. Students seeking a first baccalaureate degree must complete a minor. It is strongly recommended that CDIS majors select the Clinical Practice minor. This minor is designed to prepare students for graduate school through exposure to advanced clinical concepts and research. Students interested in working with bilingual clients should minor in Clinical Practice (Bilingual). The Health and Human Services minor is also a cross-disciplinary minor with coursework in CDIS and Social Work.

All course requirements in the major must have a grade of "C" or better. All acceptable transfer work from a junior or community college will be recorded as lower division credit.

Note: All Bachelor degrees at ENMU require 120 minimum total credit hours including 40 upper-division (300-/400-level) hours. Developmental and vocational/technical courses will not be counted toward graduation requirements.
