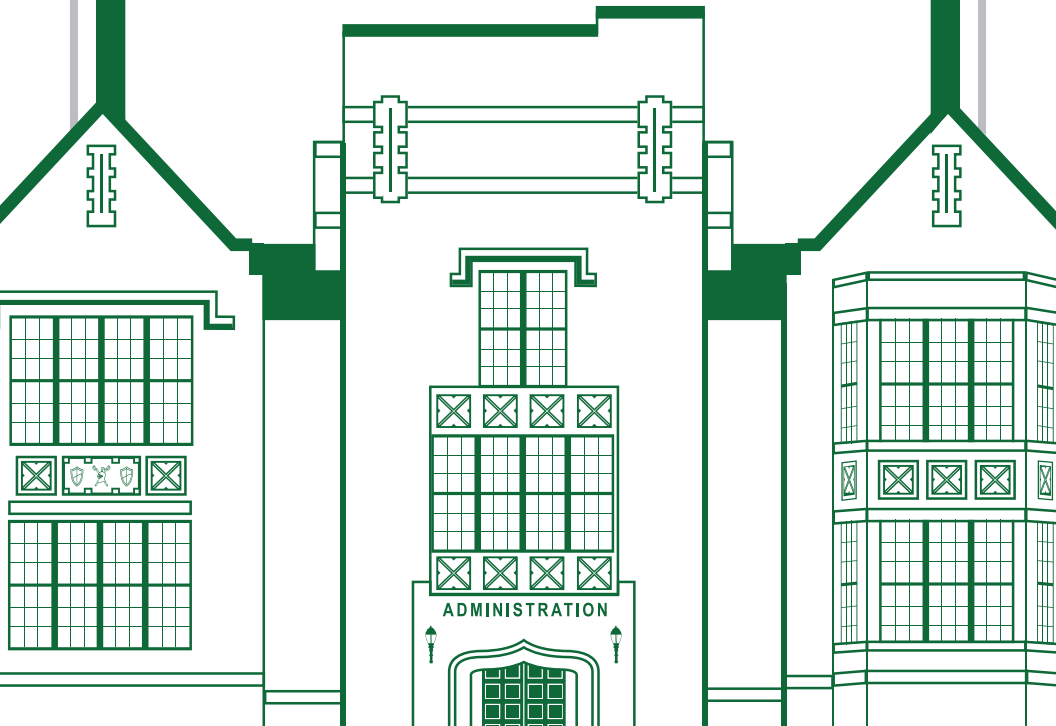

Roy and Leona Isler's commitment to education was so strong that they included ENMU as the sole beneficiary of their estate. Roy Isler earned his bachelor's degree from Texas Tech University and his Master of Arts. He established a charitable gift annuity to fund this scholarship to honor their son, Reid Allen Isler. Reid was only 21 when he was killed in the line of duty in Vietnam in 1968 while rendering aid and assistance to a wounded Marine under heavy fire. The proceeds from the Norman and Vi Petty Music Festival held in Clovis helped fund this scholarship, which assists talented students studying music technology, jazz, or music business.
