Community Health Nursing

Course Description:

Exploration of topics encountered in community health nursing, such as public health principles, epidemiology, ethics, and vulnerable populations. Utilizing public/community health theory, students complete 75 practicum hours of experiential learning through community service, community health assessment, and development/implementation of a community health project. Restricted to Nursing majors.

Course Credit Hours:

4 semester credit hours, 16 Week course.

Course Placement:

BSN: Mastery Level Undergraduate course

Course Learning Objectives:

- Verify major concepts relevant to community health nursing, including community-as-client, vulnerable aggregates, and epidemiology through reading and virtual (DCE) community activities.
- 2. Integrate nursing theory, principles of evidence-based nursing practice, and the nursing process into discussions and assignments as they relate to community and public health nursing situations.
- 3. Establish and document the community's health needs and strengths, including barriers to care, through collaboration with key members of their community and DCE virtual experiences.
- 4. Evaluate a community through a community assessment, volunteering, and the development of a community needs survey.



- Assess community needs for nursing interventions using scientific inquiry, nursing theories, evidence-based practice, collaboration, and cultural competencies.
- Develop a formal project proposal addressing a community need identified by community assessment, the needs survey, and collaboration with community stakeholders.
- 7. Implement the faculty-approved community project.

Teaching Methods:

Reading of textbook and articles
Literature review
Collaboration with key stakeholders
Sentinel City Simulation exploration
Guidance and feedback during the practicum activities
